It was wonderful to see so many eager students ready to return to school on Wednesday, with excited smiles. We extend a huge welcome to our new students and families at Roebuck Primary School this year. We are excited to have more than 20 new faces joining our school this year.

For those I haven't had the opportunity to meet yet, my name is Nikki Sandilands and I am thrilled to be the incoming Principal of Roebuck Primary School, following Mr Shem's move to Perth at the end of 2023. I am incredibly grateful by the warm welcome my family and I have received from the staff, students and families, and look forward to continue meeting you all in the coming weeks.

I would also like to welcome back Mrs Emma Dearing who has returned to Roebuck Primary School as Deputy Principal - Primary, following Mrs Ross' move to Bunbury. Mrs Dearing, along with Mrs Burton as Deputy Principal - Student Services have been working tirelessly behind the scenes, as have all of our teaching teams, to ensure that we have had such a smooth start to the year.

We have had a wonderful, yet busy start to the year, as staff returned for our two School Development days, prior to students returning on Wednesday. There certainly has been an excited buzz about the school as we have rolled out the introduction of PBS (Positive Behaviour in Schools) into the classroom and across the school. We teach positive and appropriate behaviours to our students now, just like we teach literacy and numeracy. Explicitly teaching our students positive behaviours, allows our students to demonstrate the three R's of Responsibility, Respect and Resilience. We continue to enlist the help of Pilot, our school mascot, to reward our students with 'Pilot Points' when we see students demonstrating these positive behaviours. Collectively, students work towards class goals and a whole school target of 40,000 Pilot Points for Term One. Week One saw our students off to a roaring start, amassing 3105 Pilot Points in only three days!!! I would like to acknowledge the work of the school's PBS team and all of our staff, in such a smooth implementation thus far.

*\$650 is the expected total cost inclusive of all activities, accommodation, transport and food for a five day camp. Parent fundraising has historically reduced the contribution to approximately \$300 per student. This amount per child per annum is therefore dependent and directly related to the effort and energy of the fundraising. Prior to camp, payment plans may be negotiated with the Principal.

Payment will be requested during the school year when costs and participation by students is confirmed.

At Roebuck Primary School, our commitment to fostering a positive learning environment is guided by our three behaviour expectations of Respect, Responsibility and Resilience using the WA Positive Behaviour Schools (PBS) framework.

This is an evidence-based behaviour management approach that ensures all school behaviours are explicitly defined, taught and reinforced using positive incentives. This allows all students the opportunity to achieve academic and social success in a supportive and safe environment. Research shows that by developing effective whole-school systems that are consistent, supported by data and implemented with fidelity, the wellbeing of staff and students greatly improves.

As a school community, our overarching goal is to guide students towards accountability for their behaviours, empowering them to achieve a sense of mastery and belonging to their community. Our commitment is to shape responsible, respectful and resilient individuals who contribute positively to both their immediate and broader communities.

At Roebuck Primary School, students will be rewarded with a Pilot Point for displaying appropriate behaviours. This helps to acknowledge and reinforce the positive social culture of our school and helps to encourage all students to show Respect, Responsibility and Resilience within our community. These Pilot Points will be given out consistently across the school with a common language to reinforce our effective whole-school system. Pilot Points allow students to not only work towards individual rewards, but faction, class or whole school rewards as well. Each week, teachers outline and teach our behaviour focus for the week, with plenty of opportunities for practice (just like academic

> schoolwork!). In the table below, you will find our behaviour focus for Term 1.

CYCLONE PROCEDURES

The following is an outline of the school Cyclone Procedures.

BLUE ALERT - The school is open and students attend their regular classes.

YELLOW ALERT - If a Yellow Alert is called before school, students do not attend school.

- · Bus runs are automatically cancelled.
- Parents are notified of Yellow Alert by the media (local radio as part a the standard SES message).

YELLOW ALERT - If a Yellow Alert is called during the school day, students are sent home.

- Parents are notified of Yellow Alert by the media (local radio as part a the standard SES message).
- The School Bus Coordinator informs the bus company to collect bus students.
- Parents collect students as soon as possible.
- Parents need to monitor media messages regarding school for the following day.
- NB: Parents unable to collect their children must contact the school so that alternative arrangements can be made.

RED ALERT - Schools are closed during a Red Alert.

AFTER THE CYCLONE:

- The school will be closed for at least the following day to allow for assessment and repair of serious damage.
- · Parents continue to listen to the radio to receive information as to when the school will open.
- If you require further information please do not hesitate to contact the school.


