## **ENVIRONMENT ACTION AND HEALTH & WELLBEING TEAMS**



#### Students Join Forces for WA Beach Clean Up, Collect Nearly 40kg of Litter

On Friday 29 October, a dedicated group of students from the Environment Action Team and Health & Well-being Action Team rose bright and early to participate in the state-wide WA Beach Clean Up. Gathering at Gantheaume Beach at 6 a.m., they worked together to clean up marine litter, making a significant contribution to environmental conservation. This was our second attempt at the clean-up, after our previous attempt on 11 October had to be called off due to bad weather and lightning.

The students combed the beach, removing and categorising various types of rubbish. They carefully documented every item collected, working meticulously to collate data on the litter they encountered. The collected data was later submitted to the Australian Marine Debris Initiative, helping provide valuable information for national efforts to track and address marine pollution.

In total, the students collected an impressive 39.8kg of rubbish, which included a surprising find—an old truck tyre. Their hard work not only left Gantheaume Beach cleaner and safer for wildlife but also helped contribute valuable insights into the types of waste impacting our beaches.

Thank you to all the students involved for their commitment to the environment and their role in helping protect Western Australia's beautiful coastlines!



\*\$650 is the expected total cost inclusive of all activities, accommodation, transport and food for a five day camp. Parent fundraising has historically reduced the contribution to approximately \$300 per student. This amount per child per annum is therefore dependent and directly related to the effort and energy of the fundraising. Prior to camp, payment plans may be negotiated with the Principal.

Payment will be requested during the school year when costs and participation by students is confirmed.



# **COMMUNITY NEWS**

### **USE OF ERIDEABLES**

The Road Safety Commission has provided these factsheets for parents with important information about eRideables.

It is important to know the rules around their use to keep riders and other road users safe.

#### An eRideable is an electric rideable device that:

- has at least one wheel
- is designed for one person
- doesn't go faster than 25 km/h on level ground
- weighs 25 kg or less
- is no more than 125 cm long, 70 cm wide and 135 cm high.

### Examples of eRideables include:

- eScooters
- eSkateboards
- hoverboards
- eSkates
- eUnicycles

#### Low-powered motorised scooters:

Low-powered motorised scooters do not:

- exceed 200 watts
- go faster than 10 km/h

Students under the age of 16 can ride low-powered motorised scooters.

These scooters are not considered eRideables and have their own rules.






Scooter must not be capable of travelling




