Choir Cluster Day

We had a hugely successful cluster day together on Friday, 14 June with choirs from all the other primary schools in Broome. The group travelled to Goolarri for the day and were treated to some superb rotation activities including learning new repertoire in rounds, performing on African drums called djembes, and engaging in a Spicks and Specks style quiz in teams.

The combined choir has over 120 students who all performed magnificently at the NAIDOC opening ceremony on Friday, 21 June, featuring two soloists from our choir, Mia and Duke. The choir also performed the piece 'The Flame' at our school NAIDOC assembly with pure voices. Congratulations to everyone on your hard work this term learning the song and performing with such energy.

IMSS Semester 1 concert

On Mondays, Mr Murnane wears a different hat and is a teacher in the brass instrumental program here in Broome. We have six students in Year 5 and two students in Year 6 in the IMSS program. On Monday, 17 June all of our brass musicians were involved in a concert at Lotteries House.

There was plenty of nervous energy performing to the crowd that almost topped 100 and our students showed maturity and calmness beyond their years with their focus in performing. We're so proud of what they've achieved in Semester 1 and can't wait to see where their music making goes for the remainder of the year.

In the Music classroom

The instruments have been out in full force in recent weeks to reinforce our learning of the term. Upper years have been exploring chords through music such as the 12-bar blues. Middle years have been consolidating their learning on tuned percussion like xylophones to perform known songs and exploring improvisation. Junior years have been composing for untuned percussion such as drums, maracas and clapping sticks, and have worked together to perform these pieces. Our students consistently show respect for our instruments through caring for them, with the understanding that it is everyone's responsibility to make sure the whole school has the opportunity to use instruments.

*\$650 is the expected total cost inclusive of all activities, accommodation, transport and food for a five day camp. Parent fundraising has historically reduced the contribution to approximately \$300 per student. This amount per child per annum is therefore dependent and directly related to the effort and energy of the fundraising. Prior to camp, payment plans may be negotiated with the Principal.

Payment will be requested during the school year when costs and participation by students is confirmed.

Many thanks to all our wonderful parents, grandparents and school helpers who made it such a rich and valuable learning experience.


