SPORT NEWS — TERM 1 SO FAR ...

We've kicked off the term with enthusiasm in Physical Education, diving into a variety of team-building activities that have helped students learn to work together and demonstrate sportsmanship.

For our year 1 and 2 students, we've been focusing on improving their ability to follow instructions and directions through games. We have been reviewing Fundamental Movement Skills, jumping techniques and learning to skip with a skipping rope, which has been both fun and challenging!

In years 2-3 we have been developing basketball skills such as ball handling and control, dribbling and passing. In years 4-6, we have been developing skills such as dribbling, passing, rebounding, shooting, and lay-ups. These skills will be put into practice over the next few weeks through invasion games and mini basketball games.

A special shout-out to some of our year 5 and 6 students, who have been trying out for the basketball teams that will compete later this term. Teams will be finalised by the end of week six, with more focused training starting in week seven. The competition is expected to go ahead in week nine.

*\$650 is the expected total cost inclusive of all activities, accommodation, transport and food for a five day camp. Parent fundraising has historically reduced the contribution to approximately \$300 per student. This amount per child per annum is therefore dependent and directly related to the effort and energy of the fundraising. Prior to camp, payment plans may be negotiated with the Principal.

Payment will be requested during the school year when costs and participation by students is confirmed.

Please note that transport costs related to any excursion are non-refundable.

NEW CYCLONE WARNING SYSTEM

ALERT LEVEL - ADVICE

If an Advice warning is declared, schools remain open and students are to attend as per normal.

The frequency of the updates will depend on the type of cyclone warning (ABC Radio official broadcast). The Department of Fire and Emergency Services information line phone number is 13 33 37.

The cyclone warning advice line phone number is 1300 659 210.

Check Main Roads WA website for possible road closures.

All information and updated reports relating to the warnings and school closure are also issued on ABC Radio.

Secure loose items and make the site ready for the cyclone.

ALERT LEVEL - WATCH AND ACT

If a Watch and Act is declared during a school day, the following will occur:

Watch and Act warning before 12:00pm:

- Students can be picked up immediately from the school.
- The school will close at lunch time.
- School bus operators will be informed of changes to normal operations.
- Students will not be sent home until collected by bus operators, or instructions are received from carers.

Watch and Act warning after 12:00pm:

- Students can be picked up immediately from school.
- The school will close at the normal time.
- Students will not be sent home until instructions are received from carers.

Watch and Act warning at or after 14:00 hours:

- Schools will be closed the following day.
- School to continue to listen to the radio to receive information as to when schools will open.
- The closure advice will be repeated each morning until a decision to reopen is announced based on official advice from the Department of Fire and Emergency Services.
- A decision to reopen the school is made by the Deputy Director General Schools, in consultation with the director of education.

ALERT LEVEL - EMERGENCY WARNING

If an Emergency Warning is declared, the school will remain closed.

In the event that an Emergency Warning is cancelled by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services, the director of education, in consultation with the Deputy Director General Schools, will advise when the school can re-open. This will happen only after the site has been inspected by officers from the Department of Finance.

The school will communicate school opening days/dates via SMS and email to the community.
