FROM THE PRINCIPAL

As we move into the Yawuru season of Wirralburu, we feel the cooling change that arrives around May. This is the beginning of the strengthening southeast winds—a very dry period with typically no rain, making last week's downpour, quite unseasonal. While the days remain warm, the evenings are becoming more pleasant. Wirralburu is marked by the flowering of the inland bloodwood, along with acacias such as the soap tree and pindan wattle. Bush onions are ready for harvest, lizards begin their hibernation, and traditional food sources like the kangaroo, agile wallaby, crested pigeon, and honeyeaters are in abundance.

It is also a time of reflection. Last week, we marked Sorry Day and National Reconciliation Week. These moments in our calendar invite us to listen, to learn. and to recommit ourselves to the journey of reconciliation. Through classroom learning and whole-school engagement, our students and staff have been exploring what it means to walk together with courage towards a more inclusive and just future.

We were also proud to have our staff attend the Broome Cluster Schools Conference, last Friday. This year's theme—The Strength of Culturally Connected Schools—was brought to life by inspiring keynote speakers including Professor Fiona Stanley, Daniel Principe, and Steph Armstrong OAM. Their powerful messages reinforced the importance of community, culture, and relationships in the work we do every day.

A big congratulations to all of our Cross Country participants! We were thrilled to see so many students give their best effort, and the community spirit was felt strongly with so many families attending to support. A special thanks to the parents who volunteered on the day—your generosity helps create these memorable experiences for our students.

YEAR 2 CROC WISE INCURSION

On Friday May 8, our Year 2 students from Minarla 1 and 2 were treated to a fascinating and informative incursion led by Ailsa from the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions. The session focused on the differences between **saltwater and freshwater crocodiles**, their unique behaviours, and most importantly, how to stay safe in crocodile habitats—particularly in the Kimberley region.

Ailsa's engaging presentation included eye-opening facts about crocodile conservation and the vital role these reptiles play in their ecosystems. Students were captivated by real-life examples and safety tips for exploring the natural environment responsibly.

This experience ties directly into our literacy program, as students will now be using the knowledge they gained to craft persuasive texts. Their writing will aim to inform and convince others about why crocodiles are the best animals in the world!


Mrs Duffield read the whole book. I liked the cat because the cat loves different places. The cat is very funny. I felt very relaxed on the stage. *Willow*

*\$650 is the expected total cost inclusive of all activities, accommodation, transport and food for a five day camp. Parent fundraising has historically reduced the contribution to approximately \$300 per student. This amount per child per annum is therefore dependent and directly related to the effort and energy of the fundraising. Prior to camp, payment plans may be negotiated with the Principal.

Payment will be requested during the school year when costs and participation by students is confirmed.




