SCHOOL HEALTH NURSE MESSAGE

HAND WASHING

Washing hands is the easiest way to protect ourselves from contagious illnesses, like COVID, colds, influenza, gastroenteritis and worms. Hands should be washed before and after eating or preparing food, after going to the toilet and after nose blowing.

When teaching your child to wash their hands:

- Use clean water and soap, making sure they cover their hands and wrists.
- Use a brush to clean under nails if they're dirty too (keep your child's nails short).
- Dry their hands with something clean (like a paper towel).

Alcohol based sanitisers are useful when soap and water is not available. Use half a teaspoon of the product and encourage your child to rub their hands together until they're dry.

If you can see dirt on their hands, it is better to use soap and water.

Worms

Worms are a type of parasite. It's common for children aged five to ten years to get worms when they accidentally get worm eggs on their hands and swallow them. This might happen if they come into contact with people with worms or with worm-infected dust, toys or bed linen.

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

- Worm infections don't always show symptoms.
- Very itchy bottom (or vagina in girls).
- Disturbed sleep because of itchiness.
- Irritability due to disturbed sleep and discomfort of itchiness (this is often reported by teachers).
- Evidence of worms (white threadlike specks) in faeces (poo).

This year saw a change of date to celebrate our National NAIDOC week, with the celebrations being held in November. Whilst it was a different time of year, we were all able to adapt and change within the current climate and celebrate an amazing week that was.

An incredible team effort went into having the students at Roebuck Primary School join in on theme related activities linking into "Always Was, Always Will Be" and how aboriginal people are spiritually and culturally connected to this country.

Over the week, rotations were held at the last hour of the day. These included; Story Telling by Ranger Preston from Parks and Wildlife Service, Miss Marika who showcased some short films, Mr Kent with water relay, Mrs Dearing teaching our students about the six seasons, Mrs Ross teaching students names and places of Broome by Mapping, Miss Strickland and students teaching and presenting our new NAIDOC community song and hand decorating with symbols.

We held our NAIDOC concert on Friday, 13 November which provided students and families with some amazing entertainment including the school choir singing "Dreamland". The Cultural Awareness action team performed a Dreamtime dance as taught by Shonte Molyneux, with beautiful music by Adi Cox. A huge highlight was the deadly performance by Spoonbill 2 and Ibis 6, being a combined dance item to indigenous rapper Baker Boy's song "I am in Control".

During this time and in between performances we were honoured to have Jub Clerc present as our keynote speaker. Jub is a film maker and playwright amongst many other accomplished titles.

Roebuck Primary School was treated to a smoking ceremony by Broome elder, Mary Tarran. A smoking ceremony is an ancient aboriginal custom that involves burning various native plants to produce smoke, which has cleansing properties and the ability to ward off bad spirits from the people and the land and make pathways for a brighter future.
