ANZAC DAY COMMEMORATION SERVICE



We welcome the start of Term Two with some celebratory news, having received notification from Mr Jim Bell, Deputy Director General, Student Achievement that Roebuck Primary School is one of 25 schools in the state to be appointed as a **Quality Teaching Strategy (QTS) – Lead School**, 2023 – 2024.

The QTS is the Department of Education's position on effective teaching and the aspects of school culture which support improved teaching practice. QTS lead schools will demonstrate, share and lead effective classroom instruction across the Kimberley and further afield.

This system recognition reflects my pride in all staff and shares and shows the quality of teaching and learning that is occurring through our great school.



Prior to camp, payment plans may be negotiated with the Principal.


Payment will be requested during the school year when costs and participation by students is confirmed
