#### A MESSAGE FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE

#### Ear Health

Ear disease is serious and can cause hearing loss forever. Children who have a cold, may produce mucus that can block the ears and nose, which is connected by a tube. If left untreated, the eardrum could burst leaving a hole. Unhealthy ears may cause pain and can affect how they learn in school. Children learn better with healthy ears.

If a child can't hear properly, it can be hard to:

- hear what teachers or family are saying
- learn language and talk with others
- listen to stories and music
- learn to read
- feel included and good about themselves.

For healthy ears we need to:

- wash our hands and face everyday
- eat healthy food
- teach children to blow their nose
- make sure children have regular checks ups
- never put anything in the ear.

Symptoms of ear disease:

- signs of a cold runny nose, cough or sore throat
- pain in ear
- runny fluid or pus from ear
- child pulling at ear
- fever
- child can't hear you properly
- have diarrhea, vomiting, or aren't eating properly.

If you do have a concern about your child's ear health please contact your GP. The school nurse is also available to complete hearing checks.

#### **DENTAL SCREENING NOTIFICATION**



Our Dental Therapy team will be screening students in Pre Primary, Year Three, Year Six and any new or outstanding students at Roebuck Primary School on Wednesday 19 June.

For those unfamiliar with the screening process - it is simply a growth and development check by our Dental Officer.

It is a legal requirement to screen patients every three to four years.

Please note that dental screening is a very quick non-intrusive process and is <u>not</u> a dental examination. Only students who are enrolled with the School Dental Service will be screened. If you're unsure if you have completed dental enrolment forms please call to check.

During the screening, children are lined up and simply need to bite together. The process takes approximately 5-10 seconds per child.

School Dental Services do not require parents to be present However, <u>if you wish to opt your child out of dental screening</u>, <u>please</u> <u>contact the clinic immediately to advise</u>.

If you have any queries regarding dental screening, please contact the clinic on 9195 3022 (Monday to Friday between 7:30am and 3:30pm).
