*\$650 is the expected total cost inclusive of all activities, accommodation, transport and food for a five day camp. Parent fundraising has historically reduced the contribution to approximately \$300 per student. This amount per child per annum is therefore dependent and directly related to the effort and energy of the fundraising.

WHAT IS THE LET'S DECODE PROGRAM?

Did you know that the human brain was designed to talk, not read.

This is why we need to explicitly teach our children to hear sounds in words, which in turn helps the brain to map letters to sounds when they see a word in print.

Let's Decode is an evidence based program teaching students the strategies for reading and developing their phonological awareness, the ability to recognise and manipulate the spoken parts of words and sentences.

Students in our early years participate in Let's Decode lessons four mornings a week at Roebuck Primary School. Students' phonological awareness is tracked via assessments called Dibels, once students are decoding proficiently, they can use their knowledge and skills to engage in higher order activities.

ATTENDANCE - ATTEND TODAY AND ACHIEVE TOMORROW

Missing school means your child misses out on vital information and maintaining learning routines. This can result in a loss of confidence and missing out on forming vital friendships. Classrooms at Roebuck Primary School are open at 7:45am every morning. Our school day begins at 8:00am and the class roll is completed by 8:15am.

If students arrive at school after 8:15am, parents you must accompany your child to front office, complete a late note and escort child to their teacher.

If your child needs to leave school during school hours for any reason, parents/carers are asked to report to the front office and sign the student out of school.
