NAIDOC stands for National Aborigines Islander Day Observance Committee. Its origins can be traced to the emergence of Aboriginal groups in the 1920's which sought to increase awareness in the wider community of the status and treatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians.

We promote engagement of all staff and students and welcome our wider community to participate in events and activities that encourages conversation as we move with unity in advancing our understanding of traditional history, culture and traditions.

SCHOOL REVIEW




*\$650 is the expected total cost inclusive of all activities, accommodation, transport and food for a five day camp. Parent fundraising has historically reduced the contribution to approximately \$300 per student. This amount per child per annum is therefore dependent and directly related to the effort and energy of the fundraising.
